Seeing the smiles on the faces of the children and fielding their questions about WHY we were doing what we were doing was great fun. We had parents coming up to us and asking questions. One mother of six boys inquired, "I'm embarrassed to say this, but I don't know enough about the flag and I really need to learn. I want my children to be raised right and honor our country." I referred her to the comic books and we got enough for the whole family and her. These comic books taught ME things about the flag. She was so grateful. The overall spirit of the event was so nice and pro America. What a great day.

This, again, is what the Sons of the American Legion are all about. Whether it's our members from the Culinary Cowboys entertaining and barbecuing at Veterans Homes or our fishing trips to help reconnect Veterans with those who have been through what they've been through to take pressure off of life back home, or our recent work with Habitat for Humanity where we are in the middle of participating in building a home for a Veteran who is a single father, or our fund raising to be able to provide assistance for those struggling with PTSD/PTSI... this is us.
