### REPORT TO THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

### FROM THE 2019 ELECTION COMMITTEE

COMMITTEE MEMBERS: John Lindgren, Chair Dan Ferrari Robert Carolan

BACKGROUND:

The Election Committee is appointed every year in February by the Executive Board and is tasked to ensure that the annual Post election is conducted in a proper manner and that all candidates follow the election rules as established by the Executive Board along with insuring that no negative campaigning is done. See Attachments 1 and 2, "Campaign Rules for Nominated Candidates" and "Election Committee Guidelines."

While the Committee Guidelines authorized the Election Committee to appoint members in good standing that are not running for election to assist in handing out ballots and counting votes, (see paragraph 10 in the attached Committee Guidelines). The Executive Board, instead, appointed three members to assist the committee, without consulting the committee. The appointed members were Marco Montes and Bob Brower along with Jeff Gottfredson, the manager of the Post Membership database.

On election night, two board members, Wayne Zippi and Robert Wright, showed up in the closed areas where ballots were being counted and told us that they had been sent by the Commander to oversee the counting. This was a complete surprise to the Election Committee, and this had never been done before in the history of Post 291. There is no provision for this in the election rules or bylaws.

Prior to the election, the Committee had processed a request from the Reynolds slate to send out an election mailer to members in accordance with California Corporate Code. The Election Committee had met and reviewed the proposed material and had approved it as the Committee was given the sole authority to insure that no negative campaigning takes place. The committee was notified that the Executive Board had met with no proper notice as required by the blaws for the purpose of reviewing the Reynolds campaign letter. This was especially egregious as most of the Executive Board was running in opposition to the Reynolds slate and should not have been involved in approving the campaign materials from the opposing side. According to the bylaws, Executive Board meetings require 3 days prior notice, which was not done. No minutes apparently exist for this meeting.

### **Correspondence – Election Committee Report - continued**

Perhaps the most egregious issue faced by the Election Committee this year was the negative campaigning done by the outgoing Commander who used the Post website and email blasting service to disparage the Reynolds slate by calling it a "hostile takeover", among other distortions in a multi page letter posted on the website.

As a general rule, both Mr. Reynolds and Mr. Schubert were responsive to minor issues brought up by the Election Committee and made all appropriate changes. A

couple of former Board members, however, were dismissive of issues raised by the Committee and refused to comply with requests to stop negative comments or issue retractions for inaccurate statements they made to the membership. These were the former Service Officer and the former Sgt. at Arms.

The subject of "endorsements" came up when the Schubert slate indicated that their slate was endorsed by the Auxiliary and the Sons organizations. The Election Committee was unable to locate any mention of a motion to endorse in the minutes of either of those organizations thereby making that claim inaccurate. Mike Schubert agreed to delete those endorsements when we spoke to him. Essentially, the Schubert slate was endorsed by the Commander of the SAL Squadron and the wife of the candidate! The committee felt that it was not appropriate for Legion Family to get involved in the election but there are no rules that prohibit that activity.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

1. The Election Committee is tasked with insuring that the election is done properly and that there is no negative campaigning. The problem is that while the Committee was given the responsibility, they are not given any authority to enforce the rules. Recommend that the Election Committee be given the authority to remove a candidate from the ballot if that person refuses to comply with the election rules or instructions of the Election Committee. This can be done by amending the Election Committee Guidelines.

2. The Post resources, i.e. the email blasting service and the Post web site were used as negative campaign tools. Recommend that the Executive Board require that no email blasts or web site posting be done in the period from final nominations until the election is over unless there is an urgent matter unrelated to the election. This provision should be incorporated into a revision of the Post Election Rules

3. The Executive Board, which included many members of the opposition slate, met and reviewed the election materials that were sent out by the opposing slate. The Election Rules need to be amended to make the Election Committee the sole authority for reviewing election materials. The Executive Board should have no authority to review election materials, especially if a large number of Board members are running for re-election. In addition, the Election Committee should be assigned the authority to release the Post Membership mailing list to candidates if they comply with the California Corporate Code and Post 291 Election Rules.



Then, in January, my emphasis will shift to fundraising for The American Legion Veterans and Children's


