California Military Department -Missions

Army and Air National Guard

- Fight out nation's wars. Since 9/11 California National Guard members have deployed 50,000
- CANG, CAANG and CSG
- Disaster response and support of civil
- authorities California State Guard is a State agency.
- Community -CMD sponsored
- California Cadet Corp
- Grizzly, Sunburst, Discovery Youth Academies
- Oakland Military Institute
- · Work for Warriors





(ALGUARD) Who is the California State Guard

- · State military force, not a warfighting force
- · Hold same ranks and privileges as National Guard
- Majority of personnel are volunteers. Only paid if called up or on training duty
- · Both prior service and non-prior service.
- · Membership standards different than active duty.
- · Governor can call up when needed When activated, paid at the same rate as federal forces





Not subject to Federal call up or overseas deploymen



CSG Army Component

- · All units integrated with counterpart National Guard unit
- JFHQ & Division HQ Staff
- Infantry Brigade
- Specialty Staff (Chaplain, JAG, Etc)
- · Enhance training of National Guard
 - Marksmanship Team
- OPFOR role players
- Medic training
- Evaluators
- Vehicle / Rotary maintenance
 Admin and supply functions
- · Disaster response and civil support







CSG Air Component

- · All units integrated with California Air National Guard
- · Training support to Wings and Groups
- · Aerial Port Squadron, augmentation for CAANG
- · Humanitarian support
- · Responsible for the State Alternate Joint Operations Center at JFTB Los Alamitos







CSG Maritime Component

- Littoral Command (inshore/offshore <3 mi)
 - Operate small watercraft (Rescue/Jon Boats)
 - Perform surface Search and Rescue
 - · Flood rescue and evacuation,
 - · Swift water rescue
- · Force packages are air transportable
- Coastal Command (inshore/coastal waters)
 Operate small- to medium-sized watercraft
- - Perform waterborne courtesy, security, and enforcement missions
 - Watercraft assistance
 - Maritime patrol
 Permissive enforcement (Fisheries/Pollution Control)
 - Perform surface and subsurface Search, Rescue and Recovery

CSG OPS GRP

- CSG force dedicated to emergency and disaster response
 - · Not permanently aligned to National Guard Units, however may be temporarily assigned for state emergencies
- . Joint Command integrating members from CSG Army, Air & Maritime Components
- · Range of missions include:
 - Wildland Firefighting
 - Cyber Defense · Generator and Power
- Search and Rescue
- Shelter Operations
- · General purpose response







CSG - Cyber Command

- · California Cybersecurity Integration Center
 - · Manned by Office of Emergency Services, California Military Department and CHP
- · Primary mission is to reduce the likelihood and severity of cyber incidents that could damage California's economy, critical infrastructure, or public and private sector computer networks.
- · California is the only state to have a proactive cybersecurity office that is manned by a State Guard
- · High demand. Consistently recruiting talented individuals

CSG JAG - Legal

- Able to represent service members and families in state court regarding matters relating to Soldiers and Sailors relief act, family law and other areas
- Represents CSG service members in investigations, administrative and courts martial proceedings
- Provides legal support to CAARNG, CAANG and Coast Guard
- Support other agencies 24/7 on government laws and regulations, cyber, and environmental issues





CSG Medical

- State Surgeon Office; Senior Command responsible for policy development throughout the CSG.
- Joint Medical Command. Manages and assigns Providers for internal missions and external for emergency response
- CSG Component medical personnel. Direct support to commands and field units.
- Medical Specialties: Surgeons, P.A.'s, Nurses, Lab Tech, Pharmacy, EMT, MA's.





CSG Museum Command

- Responsible for curating and preserving the history of both the National and State Guard
- · Funded by Legislation
- Operates museums at Joint Force Training Base, Camp San Luis Obispo, and Camp Roberts
- Collects, organizes and produces after action reports.








