Terms of Reference: The purpose and objectives of the Election Voting Process Committee are to assess the current voting process for the Post annual election of officers, and to make recommendations to the E-Board for any changes or modifications, if any, to the current process required by the Bylaws. If any changes or modifications are recommended, the deliverable by the Committee shall provide a full description of voting method recommended and how it will ensure the integrity of the voting process, including:

- 1. Method for verification of Post 291 Membership and eligibility to vote.
- 2. Procedures for distributing the ballot.
- 3. Procedures for maintaining security and secrecy of voter's ballot.
- 4. Method for receiving and safeguarding completed ballots.
- 5. Method for counting votes
- 6. Method for conveying election results to Election Committee.


